The Consortium's goal is to recruit more Native American, African Americans and Hispanics into master's programs for Business and Education. They have programs that cover full tuition and mandatory fees for two years of full-time study (Emory also offers a one-year program).

Students who are interested in pursuing their MBA should start preparing to take their GRE or GMAT before they complete their bachelors or right after graduation. Candidates chosen for the Consortium's MBA program should have a good grade point average, be active in leadership in community activities, college organizations, work professional organizations, life experience, and a person who shares the desire to help minorities advance in Business and Education opportunities.

The Consortium's common application, will allow you to apply to up to six of the country's leading MBA programs. This is a time- and money-saving tool that can give you an edge as you seek to begin the next stage of your career. They will begin to take applications August 15, 2016. The early deadline is October 15, 2016, and the final deadline is January 5, 2017.

A single application with The Consortium allows you to apply for up to six Consortium schools. This saves time, of course—but also money. Application fees are tiered based on how many member schools you apply for.

- \$200: Three schools
- \$240: Four schools
- \$275: Five schools
- \$300: Six schools
