## Register with Grad Horizons for 2018

Graduate Horizons is a four-day workshop for Native college students, college graduates, and master's students in preparing for graduate school (master's, Ph.D. or professional school). Graduate Horizons partners with 45 university graduate/professional degree programs. Admission officers, professors and deans will mentor and advise students on the admissions process, professional/career development, and the various fields of study, research, and the graduate programs that are available.

Eligibility:

- Be American Indian, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian, or First Nations of Canada AND provide appropriate tribal/ancestry documentation (copies of relevant tribal enrollment forms issued from a state or federally recognized tribe or verified Hawaiian documentation);
- Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States;
- Be a current college student (at an accredited community college, tribal college/university, or 4 year institution), OR A college graduate, OR a student in a master's degree program interested in pursuing a second advanced degree;
- Minimum Course Work: Have completed the equivalent of 2 years of college course work by June 2018;
- Minimum GPA: Have a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average; and
- Submit a completed application packet by the deadline.

The 2018 deadline will be sometime in February 2018. Additional application requirements are found at <http://www.graduatehorizons.org/application-process>. A scholarship is available and if applying for the scholarship; you need to apply early.
